# WPS Student Behaviour Management Code

Whole school rules are implemented at the start of the year based on Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) criteria of 'Be safe, be respectful, be responsible'.

Classroom rules are linked to whole school rules and inappropriate behaviours result in:

#### <u>Classroom</u>

Reminder(s) and class time out for low level inappropriate behaviours and non compliance.

#### Support class

For continued low level inappropriate or more significant behaviours. (Blue Slip to be filled in)

Students complete work or Plan as negotiated, in an amount of time determined by the teacher, and then return to class.

Where appropriate Restorative Conference Occurs.

### **Office Time-Out**

For repeated, persistent inappropriate behaviours or any extreme or disruptive behaviour

Students come to office with work for negotiated period of time, and where appropriate a Restorative Conference occurs, a plan is made and student returns to class. Parent contact is made.

### <u>YARD</u>

For low level behaviours, the teacher will talk to the student and provide a logical consequence. This could include students walking with the teacher or sitting out. For other unacceptable behaviours, such as, violence, harassment or non-compliance, the student may be placed on restricted play, complete community service or be sent immediately to the Office.

School Leadership Response Office Time Out (May include) Restorative Conference and Plan Blue slips are filled in when student behaviour is inappropriate and reminders or logical consequences have been ineffective for the behaviour of concern.

Class teachers will monitor student behaviour and advise Principal if a pattern appears

Parents of students who have a pattern of inappropriate behaviour will be contacted by teachers first and an early alert meeting may be held with Principal support.

High level response will involving contacting parents and may result in Take Home, Suspension or Exclusion.

### **Possible responses:**

- Behaviour coach referral
- Counselling of students
- Parents and caregiver notified, in writing or by phone, and meeting arranged
- Immediate take home
- Yard suspension
- External suspension (max 5 days)
- Exclusion (up to 10 weeks)

This process is not necessarily sequential

Any violent, harassing or illegal behaviour will result in a Principal response.
