Hello families and welcome to **pre-camp week**! We have some very excited children (and staff) at school, with final preparations well in hand. If you have any concerns or queries, please reach out to us. We can even help with sleeping bags if you are in need!

It is vital we know ahead of time what your intentions are so we can finalise staffing arrangements. If children are not attending, please contact the school to discuss what these 3 days will look like for your child.

Three messages were posted to **Seesaw** on the weekend, a camp update, a survey and a change of date to the AGM. Seesaw is used extensively to send reminders and notifications which are time sensitive, however these messages were seen by less than half the intended recipients. If you did not see them, could you please check that you are receiving push notifications so you do not miss out on important information. Information on the GC and AGM is repeated here:

The date of the **AGM and first Governing Council meeting** has changed due to a diary conflict. The AGM will now be held at 6:30 on Monday 27th Feb and is open to ALL parents and carers of children enrolled at Wasleys Primary School. It is a brief meeting where we present the last AGM minutes, present the financial summary for 2022, present the 2022 Annual Report to the Community and accept nominations to Governing Council. Those nominated to council then meet to elect position holders, discuss dates for Pupil Free Days and future meetings. Your voice is important and we are looking for more parents to join the Governing Council, so please consider attending the AGM to find out more. Governing Council meets twice a term in the evenings and meetings usually last about an hour.

The term has started well, with our new students welcomed warmly into our school community and quickly settling in to school life. At both events, your children represented the school beautifully, engaging with curiosity, showing respect, and earning praise from instructors and musicians. The band played music from popular games, tv and movies and encouraged children to participate with clapping, clicking, singing and dancing. One student was so impressed he hi fived each member after the performance and told them "Well done, good job!" Another student stated that they needed to come back next year when his sister starts school "so she can hear their beautiful music".




PROPOSED Pupil Free Days


